Combined Driving and Show Jumping Unite at Live Oak Event

Live Oak International is the largest international-level combined driving and show jumping tournament in the country and this year welcomes the leading drivers, riders, trainers, coaches and owners from Europe and North America on March 16-19.

In 1990, Charlotte Weber and her son Chester C. Weber were approached about hosting the marathon portion of a club-level driving competition being held at the Ocala Arabian Complex. The Weber family welcomed this invitation and the beautiful Live Oak Stud was first utilized as the grounds to host a competition. After observing the tournament at his family's property, Chester Weber, world champion four-in-hand driver, first competed at LOI in 1995 in the Horse Pair Division. In 1997, Weber began devoting his time to developing the combined driving sport in the United States. Now co-president alongside his sister, Juliet W. Reid, and his niece Chloe D. Reid, Chester is one of the most exciting drivers to watch.

While on a visit to the family-hosted tournament, Chloe asked why the world-class facility couldn't host her equestrian discipline of choice, show jumping, thus in 2012, Live Oak International expanded to international show jumping.

The competition has grown throughout the years, and now regularly hosts the U.S. Equestrian Federation combined driving national championships as well as the final leg of the qualifier for the Longines FEI World Cup™ Jumping North American League. With show jumping came ringside hospitality and world-class entertainment.

The venue of Live Oak Stud offers a picturesque setting and the 5,000-acre property is home to hundreds of cattle, as well as Live Oak Stud, an award-winning Thoroughbred breeding, training and racing operation. Racing under white silks with red polka dots and black sleeves, homebreds from the program have enjoyed success in the Breeders' Cup World Championships wins, Eclipse Awards, Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association awards and multiple Grade 1 wins on the dirt and the turf. In 2018, Live Oak Stud celebrated 50 years of excellence and has been named Florida's Thoroughbred breeder and owner of the year multiple times.

The Marion Therapeutic Riding Association has been serving Marion, Lake, Sumter and Alachua counties for 40 years. A celebration will take place on Feb. 4 at CF Vintage Farm from 6 to 10 p.m. MTRA provides equine assisted services to individuals with physical, intellectual and emotional challenges. Programs include therapeutic riding, equine assisted learning, PTSD psychotherapy for Veterans in partnership with the Ocala Vet Center and speech and language pathology through hippotherapy in partnership with Advent health.

"Community support is what has driven this organization to a successful 40 years of service," Executive Director Pam Morrison said.

MTRA relies heavily on the generosity of the community and businesses through donations, grants and other funding. MTRA has provided therapeutic horseback riding or Equine Assisted Therapy sessions to thousands of individuals. In recent years the program has seen an increase





Jafmil Joins Stallions at Pleasant Acres


Jafmil joins thoroughbred breeding stallions Amira's Prince (Ire), Bucchero, Curlin's Honor, Gone Astray, Gunnevera, Leinster, Long On Value, Magic On Tap, Neolithic, No Never No More, and Sweetontheladies, at the 220-acre Pleasant Acres Stallions located just northwest of Ocala.

He is a son of Distorted Humor out of the multiple stakes winning Storm Cat mare, Pleasant Temper, by Storm Cat. His sire has 55 graded stakes winners and 15 Grade 1 winners to his credit with \$132 million in progeny earnings.

His dam, Pleasant Temper, finished on the board 22 of 33 career starts amassing nearly \$850,000. She has produced five winners from six starters.

Draft Horse Show Creates New Fans

The Advent Health Grandview Invitational Draft Horse Show thunders into the Florida Horse Park Feb. 3-5 featuring three days of equestrian showmanship with worldclass hitch wagons and drivers that demonstrate the unique talent of draft horse breeds. Top North American hitches drawn by clydesdales, percherons and belgians will take over the park's covered arena now in its fifth year as the county's only all-draft horse show. Gates open at 8 a.m. The show runs noon until 3 p.m.

Put together by Hall of Fame clydesdale breeders Shannon and Karen Cobbs, Grandview Invitational brings in a showcase of breeds often underrepresented in Horse Capital of the World[®] as most hitches exist in the Midwest. The Cobbs have been showing drafts for more than 40 years and own Grandview Clydesdales in Dunnellon, a tour site for one of the largest clydesdale breeding operations in North America and renowned



for black clydesdales in addition to the traditional bays. The Invitational was created out of their love of the draft equestrian sport and a desire to bring a truly unique horse show experience to Marion County.

Spectators will enjoy a wide range of classes, from the graceful and elegant "Ladies Cart" class with a single horse and driver to the "Six" and " Eight Horse Hitch" classes creating a powerhouse of up to 168 one-ton horses hitched as teams and at one point all in the ring at the same time. Witnessing some of the most physically powerful horses in the world in the ring all at once is a sensory experience like no other and many are left in awe.

Admission tickets range from \$20 for adult online tickets to \$475 VIP packages for the daytime show at the Florida Horse Park. Each evening the horses also appear at the Grandview World Nights at the World Equestrian Center from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. with Happy Hour at 6:30 p.m. and a party at 7:30 p.m. in Arena 5.
